Still, perhaps, we choose the stuff to surround us and give us temporary pleasure, but still no lasting joy in this part of the world. However, there is the possible blessing that we can use the stuff for the common good, for the Body of Christ, for our own growth towards God. We need to remember that all is blessing and choose to point ourselves in the direction that opens our spirit to His joy.

I see this often in musicians, vocalists, photographers, artists, writers, speakers, administrators, assistants, physicians, nurses, mechanics, coaches, teachers, engineers, machinists, farmers, truckers, athletes, mothers, fathers, young adults .... ## Pre-Cursillo News...

Welcome to the season of Advent, a time of preparation for Christmas. We watch as the Advent wreath lights another candle each week representing hope (first Sunday), preparation (second Sunday), joy (third Sunday), and love (fourth Sunday). We see purple vestments, reminding us of this time of preparation (sometimes we see a pink or rose vestment on the third Sunday of Advent, a sign of the joy to come at Christmas). We celebrate the Feasts of the Immaculate Conception and Our Lady of Guadalupe, reminding us of Mary. In the readings we hear 'Prepare the way of the Lord'. How are you preparing for the birth of Jesus?

Our spring weekends may seem a ways off yet, but they will be here before we know it. The men's weekend will be March 12-15, 2020, and the women's weekend will be April 23-26, 2020. Do you have candidates in mind? Now is the time to be making those contacts with prospective candidates. If you have candidate applications, please send them in now, don't wait until right before the weekends. We need to have our numbers turned into the Pines no later than two weeks prior to the weekend, so candidate applications need to be turned in no later than three weeks prior to the weekend. The earlier applications are turned in, the better we can prepare for the weekends. Applications for the men's weekend need to be turned in by Feb. 20, 2020, and the women's weekend by April 2, 2020. Applications can either be sent in the mail, or emailed to me (see below for address and email).

With our new Cursillo website up and running, you will now be able to download candidate and sponsor applications. You can also contact me for copies. We do have a new application, so if you have old ones lying around, please dispose of them. We would like to have all applications on the new form as it gives us better information. Also please make sure that you send in your sponsor app at the same time, and that all signatures are completed (this includes the candidate, their pastor, and you as sponsor). If these are not in place, we won't be able to process the app in a timely way. As always, if you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

We will have no School of Leaders in December. Next School of Leaders meeting will be in Jan. 2020. Check the Jan. Ark for date, time, and presenters.


